Letter from the Board of Trustees:

While preparing for the third year of learning in the larger Little Red Schoolhouse, we would like to share with the entire community how things continue to grow and at the same time challenge our unique school.

As a result of the pandemic, school districts were awarded federal grant funding to assist with the learning loss of students. The district upgraded classroom technology with interactive whiteboards and purchased Chromebooks for every student. These technological enhancements have supported the learning growth of each student. Additional STEM, reading and writing program materials were purchased. In summer 2022 and again in summer 2023 we will offer a Summer Enrichment Program to our current students and incoming kindergarten class.

A great addition to our Schoolhouse is "The Little In-Between Library" located in the adjoining breezeway between the original and new Little Red buildings. The district purchased book shelving and a wide variety of literature titles for our students to take home and enjoy story time with their family. A huge "thank you" to all our parents and community members for donating books!

In 22-23 we increased our occupational therapy, speech, special education services and social emotional learning curriculum to meet the needs of our students. Approximately 50% of the North Greenbush annual budget goes to support tuition and transportation costs of district students that attend our partnering school districts.

With a new, larger school building it has been necessary to increase the amount of time the custodial staff spend maintaining the building. In addition, rising costs of insurance, technology, gas, and electricity to operate the building have increased our expenditures. As the building enters its third year of full operation we must start planning for routine painting, repairs, window cleaning and service of the HVAC system.

As members of the community who are ultimately responsible for the operation and management of the school district, we are concerned about and will continue to monitor several residential housing developments that are being discussed and proposed within the district's boundaries. We project an increase in student numbers as the district continues to grow.

During the term of the school construction project, the fund balance was used to support the annual budget and early construction costs. With the completion of the project \$3,696,000 in serial bonds were issued as permanent financing for the project. The bonds will be paid back over the next 19 years which began in 2022-2023 budget year.

Your Board of Trustees would like to extend a special Thank You to our community for your continued support of The Little Red Schoolhouse.

The school budget increase is 6.04% The tax levy limit (tax cap) is 8.08%

A school district's tax levy can be separated into two major components. #1 are taxes collected to support the general, daily operations of a school such as salary and benefits, maintenance, and utilities as well as transportation. #2 are taxes collected to support capital expenditures such as serial bonds issued for the new school addition.

Only taxes for #1 figure into the calculation of the tax levy limit. #2 capital expenditures are excluded from the tax levy limit calculation because serial bonds are legal obligations which must be paid regardless of other revenue and expenditure considerations. For 23-24 approximately 7.81% of the proposed school budget is for debt service.

ABSENTEE BALLOTS

Qualified district resident voters who are unable to go to the polls on May 16, 2023, can cast their vote by absentee ballot. <u>Applications</u> for absentee ballots can be requested at the District Office 49 North Greenbush Rd., Troy, New York. The last day that the District Office can mail an absentee ballot to voters who have submitted a completed absentee ballot application, is May 10, 2023. **Absentee Ballots must be received by 3:00pm May 16, 2023.**

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Q: How is the tax levy calculated?

A: The tax levy is the amount of dollars needed in order to balance the school district budget. By state law the tax levy increase is limited to an amount called a tax cap.

Q: How is the NYS Tax Cap Calculated?

A: The school tax cap is a formulated calculation based on a number of factors such as prior year's levy, allowable levy growth factor of 2% or rate of inflation (whichever is lower), tax base growth factor, pilots and if any specific exclusions such as bonded debt service. Please refer to chart below to see the history of tax cap calculations are that we have been including in these newsletters.

Q: What is the difference between the tax levy and the tax rate?

A: The tax levy is the amount of dollars needed in order to balance the budget. The tax rate is used to determine how much any specific piece of property (residential, commercial or industrial) contributes to the overall tax levy. It is calculated by using the amount of the taxes that need to be levied divided by the total amount of the taxable assessed residential and commercial property in the school district.

Senior Citizen Tax Exemption

Partial tax exemption is offered to persons who are 65 years of age or older with limited incomes. The property owners must file an application annually, on forms prescribed by the State Board, in the assessor's office by March 1st before the day for filing the final assessment role or such other times as may be hereinafter fixed by law.
